Biographical/Historical Note

Dr. Robert Schick is an archaeologist and a historian of the Byzantine and Islamic periods with a special interest in the city of Jerusalem during the Islamic periods. He has worked on excavation projects in Jordan for many years. He is currently preparing the final report of an archaeological excavation conducted by ACOR from 1992-1993 of the Burnt Palace, a Byzantine-Early Islamic building in Madaba.
